





BUILDING A STORY Popular!



How Do You Write and Illustrate a Picture Book?

In this session, readers will learn how I created both text and illustrations for a story. We'll focus on Grama's Hug or My Name Is Not Ed Tug (school's choice) and I'll use my "Story Steps" to break down the story-making process. Each step represents an element needed to create a fictional story: inspiration, problem, characters, research, revisions and...teamwork (in the book publishing phase)! This engaging presentation invites participation, even during virtual visits!

MIGHTY MAIN CHARACTERS

How Do You Create Powerful Characters?

Who are your favorite characters? Students will learn how to develop their own cast of story characters by creating personality traits. We'll explore popular characters in literature and discuss what makes them memorable. I'll share the evolution of my own character designs and identify how revisions strengthened them. This fun presentation concludes with kids nominating a favorite book character for your school!

YOUR STORY JOURNAL

Turning Your Experiences into Stories

Each story I create stems from a favorite memory, detail or sometimes even a sentence blurted out by a nearby stranger! I share my abstract story journal with students and show them how it generates story concepts. In this interactive presentation, we'll create a rough Mad Lib style two-sentence story kids can continue to develop after my visit!
